TUITION FEE GUIDELINES AND CONDITIONS

Application and Placement Test: This is a one-off, non-refundable charge. Please be advised that payment of the application fee does not secure a guaranteed place for the student.

New Student Enrolment: This is a one-off, non-refundable charge, payable upon the formal offer of a place and prior to the student's commencement. Each offer is subject to a specific payment deadline; failure to settle the fee by this date will result in the offer lapsing. Consequently, the vacancy may be reallocated to candidates on our waiting list.

Security & Library Book Deposit: This deposit is refundable upon the student's withdrawal, subject to the required notice period being observed and the completion of all formal exit documentation. The refund will be processed following the clearance and deduction of any outstanding charges

Acceptance and Enrolment: Upon the offer of a place, an invoice for tuition and associated fees will be issued. To secure the placement and formalise enrolment, payment must be settled in full within 7 working days of the invoice date.

Sibling Discount: Discounts on Tuition Fee will be applied for siblings who are in the school at the same time, as follows: Second child 10%; Third child 15% and Fourth child onwards 20%

School Activities: School Activities encompass all organised programmes, events, and experiences designed by the school to support a pupil's academic, social, physical, and emotional development. Please note that activities vary by year group. This definition excludes overnight residential trips, which may incur separate charges. Our school activities include :

Academic Activities

These initiatives focus on enhancing curriculum-based skills, academic learning, and showcasing the scholarly potential of our pupils.

- **Book Week:** Literacy and linguistic development initiatives.
- **Sustainability Week:** Environmental awareness and sustainable development learning.
- **International Week:** Exploration of geography, diverse cultures, and global citizenship.
- **Art & Music Afternoon Tea Exhibition:** A showcase of pupils' visual arts and musical performances.
- **VbE Celebration:** Celebrating our core values through Values-based Education.
- **MOLI (Meritton Outreach & Leadership Initiative):** Experiential learning through leadership development and community-focused corporate social responsibility projects.
- **Science Fair:** An opportunity for pupils to explore scientific inquiry, present experimental findings, and foster a passion for discovery.
- **Wai Kru Celebration:** A traditional Thai ceremony paying respect to teachers.
- **Spirit Week:** Activities dedicated to fostering school pride and a positive atmosphere.
- **Sports Days:** Promoting physical health, teamwork, and school spirit.
- **World Values Day:** a meaningful whole-school experience that strengthens character, celebrates our shared values, and includes community engagement events alongside an on-site celebration that brings students, staff, and parents together.
- **Loy Krathong:** Preservation and celebration of the traditional Thai Loy Krathong festival.
- **Children's Day:** Dedicated activities celebrating Children's Day.
- **Extra-Curricular Activities (ECAs):** Complimentary after-school clubs providing pupils with the opportunity to explore new hobbies and develop skills in a social environment.
- **Field Trips (Primary & Above):** Educational excursions that extend learning beyond the classroom, providing pupils with hands-on, real-world experiences.

School Events

These events are designed to foster a sense of community, celebrate seasonal festivities, and honour cultural traditions.

- **Christmas Celebration:** Festivities marking the Christmas season.
- **Songkran Celebration:** Traditional Thai New Year festivities.
- **End of Academic Year Celebration:** Commemorating the conclusion of the academic year and pupil achievements.

Remark: All scheduled activities and programmes are subject to change at the school's discretion, as deemed appropriate and without prior notice.



Capital Improvement Fee: To continue providing a safe, engaging, and high-quality learning environment, the school carries out ongoing improvements to classrooms, facilities, and learning resources. The Capital Improvement Fee is a yearly contribution dedicated specifically to these long-term developments. Unlike tuition fees, which support daily teaching and operations, this fund is reinvested directly into upgrading learning spaces, enhancing safety systems, and introducing improved equipment and technology for students. Through steady improvements each year, students benefit from an environment that better supports their learning, wellbeing, and overall school experience.

English Language Learner - (ELL): From Year 1 onwards, specialised English Language Learner (ELL) support is provided for pupils whose English proficiency is determined to be below the threshold required to engage successfully with the curriculum. Should the school deem intensive language support essential for a student's academic progress, participation in the programme is mandatory. Pupils are assessed at regular intervals to evaluate their readiness to exit the programme. The acquisition of formal academic language typically requires a more sustained duration than that of everyday social communication.

Chromebook Usage Fee: This fee encompasses the provision of school-owned Chromebooks for instructional use, including system administration, licensed software, routine maintenance, and dedicated technical support throughout the academic year. This coverage is exclusive of repairs necessitated by negligence, loss, or misuse, which will incur additional charges.

Parent-Teacher Organisation (PTO): This fee is allocated directly to the Parent-Teacher Organisation, an independent body dedicated to fostering a strong partnership between the school and the parent community. These funds are managed by the PTA to support essential school-wide initiatives, enrichment projects, and community-led contributions that enhance the educational experience for all pupils.

Uniforms: All pupils are required to wear the prescribed Meritton British International School uniform. Items are available for purchase directly from the onsite school shop. Uniform costs are exclusive of tuition and other mandatory fees.

Parents and Guardians Visa Fee: This fee is applicable for the administrative support and coordination provided by the school in relation to parental visa applications. Such charges are exclusive of any government-mandated fees or additional processing costs, which are the responsibility of the applicant and must be paid directly to the appropriate authorities.

Cambridge Checkpoint Examination Fees: Fees are applicable to pupils registered for these international assessments, provided by Cambridge Assessment International Education. This charge is independent of standard tuition fees and applies exclusively to candidates undertaking the examinations. The fee encompasses registration, examination administration, and the coordination of all necessary documentation. Annual rates are determined based on the schedules set by Cambridge, alongside relevant administrative costs for each academic year.

Duke of Edinburgh's Award (DoE): A prestigious, globally recognised programme for students aged 14–24 to develop leadership and resilience through service, skills, physical activity, and expeditions. Earning a Bronze, Silver, or Gold Award significantly enhances university portfolios and career prospects, empowering pupils to excel well beyond the classroom.

Paid Extra Curricular Activities: The school provides a diverse range of Extra-Curricular Activities (ECA) designed to nurture pupils' talents and interests beyond the core curriculum. These optional programmes are scheduled outside the standard academic timetable, with the majority facilitated by our internal teaching staff and offered free of charge. Certain specialised activities led by visiting professionals may incur additional fees. Participation remains entirely at the discretion of parents and pupils, and full details regarding schedules and costs will be provided in advance of each registration period.

Residential Trips Fee: Residential trips (Overnight Trip) are organised for pupils in designated year groups to foster independence and enhance social development. These excursions involve overnight stays at approved locations and are designed to complement the curriculum. Costs for residential trips are supplementary to tuition fees and will be charged based on the specific destination and itinerary.



Payment Timeline for New Enrolments

The Enrolment Fee is payable within 7 days of the formal offer of admission for the 2026 academic year. This payment is required to confirm and secure the place.

Payment Timeline for Tuition Fees

All tuition fees must be settled with the Accounting Department in accordance with the following deadlines:

- Term 1: By 29th May 2026
- Term 2: By 30th November 2026

Admissions During the Academic Year

For pupils joining part-way through a term, all tuition fees must be settled in full no later than 7 days prior to their intended start date.

Tuition Fee Refund Policy

1. Tuition fees are refundable in accordance with the following terms and conditions:
 - Prior to the commencement of the term: 70% refund of tuition fees.
 - Withdrawal within weeks 1–4 of the term: 60% refund of tuition fees.
 - Withdrawal within weeks 5–8 of the term: 30% refund of tuition fees.
 - Withdrawal from the 9th week of the term onwards: No refund will be granted.
2. Once paid, the New Student Enrolment Fee and/or Place Reservation Deposit Fee (for Current and New Students) are non-refundable under all circumstances.
3. Except for the tuition fees as stated above (Clause 1) and the Security and Library Book Deposit, all other fees are non-refundable under all circumstances.

Exceptional Circumstances and Force Majeure

In the instance of an unplanned school closure necessitated by force majeure or other unpredictable events beyond our reasonable control, tuition fees remain non-refundable. The rescheduling of any lost academic days is at the sole discretion of the School Director, should it be deemed essential to ensure that all educational objectives are fulfilled.

Overdue Payment

Overdue Payment Fee: Maximum 15% per year. Further details available from the Accounts Department.
